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## Day 1 Yorkshire Dales (73 miles)

The film *"From Harrogate it Started"* is a unique view of the 1971 RAC Rally. Today we were privileged to be counted amongst the cast of a contemporary homage to an undoubted golden age of rallying, for our fourth edition of the *Generations Rally* - the gateway event to the addiction that is endurance rallying.

We're on home turf for this first rally of 2025, kicking off another epic year, over which we're set to enjoy 50 days of rallying from God's own County to the Land of the Rising Sun via the Emerald Isle and the Andalusian Campo. *Rally the Globe* is based in Leeds and it was in Yorkshire that we emerged blinking into the post-pandemic era for the first of our *Cloverleaf* events.

For the next few days we've taken up residence in the imposing splendour of the Majestic Hotel in Harrogate; from where we'll be dealt another dose of Regularities, Tests and map work courtesy of Iain Tullie and Anthony Preston.

The entry list shows we have another full house. Because the all-important scrutineering checks would have overwhelmed the hotel car park, the Organisers have setup camp in the grounds of the nearby Army Foundation College, where all manner of adjustments and titivations were attended to by the crews.

Thankfully, most jobs were minor, with anything major left to the crack platoon of sweeps comprising Andy Inskip, Charlie Neale, Russ Smith, Owen Turner, Oscar Woodward and Dave Aincham. Replacing Porsche light-bulbs was possibly the most common task of the morning. Simon and Dan Spinks' Mini needed some more serious attention. What was initially thought to be a faulty condenser was diagnosed by Owen Turner as fuel system related. With Mini Spares Harrogate on speed dial, the carburettor was stripped and rebuilt and car 96's later start time was put to full use.

Roisin and Patrick Timpson were also grateful for this local Mini merchant. Their Bristol 411's alternator had failed, leaving Andy Inskip and Charlie Neale no choice but to fit whatever was available.

The morning was slightly more relaxed for the rest of the crews and, once signed on, with paperwork sorted courtesy of Audrey Rudd, Gill Cotton, Andrew Kellitt and Jordyn Mitchelldyer, they sat down to make sense of the route book maps and diagrams.

As midday approached a buffet lunch was preceded by a welcome briefing from the Clerk of the Course, Mark Appleton. Then the rally decanted into the car park, firedup their engines and lined up ready for the start.

Fred Gallagher did the honours with the flag, setting the cars on a course for three Tests at Harewood Hillclimb. The first one, through the cones in the Paddock, was followed by a short section of hillclimb and a longer, more satisfying, ascent through the Armco to the summit, and on to the first Regularity at Lindley.

As well as some stunning landscape, early spring in Yorkshire gave us some dramatic weather, with the sunshine getting the better of the showers thanks to a stiff

breeze keeping the clouds moving. As we charged towards a Passage Control at Beamsley Beacon, 390m above sea level, clumps of well-rooted daffodils clung to the verges.

For the novice crew members this was a short, but intense, session. The Time Control at Bolton Abbey offered the opportunity to rest and recover before climbing over Pock Stones Moor towards the next Test at the Pateley Bridge Showfield. Here they got to grips with another selection of cones, chicanes and the ever popular "stop astride".

Narrow roads and dry-stone walls led us through a patchwork of fields to the Dacre Pasture Regularity, immediately followed by a map-based Passage Control section around Birstwith and the Nidd Valley.

The day ended with a short run into Harrogate and the Majestic Hotel where a good dinner and a well-stocked bar finished off a very enjoyable day.

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# Day 2 Yorkshire Moors and Wolds (169 miles)

### 29 March 2025

Yesterday served as a gentle introduction to the fine art of endurance rallying, but today - true to form - the Organisers stepped things up a gear. A packed programme was scheduled, designed to gradually push the cars and crews to somewhere just outside of their comfort zone.

It was a long day for sure, and a hard one certainly, but thanks to the good weather, amazing roads and sheer variety of Tests and Regularities, the time fairly flew by as we rolled over the seemingly endless hills and dales of Yorkshire.

The day began with a pair of exhilarating Tests around Dishforth Airfield, allowing the drivers to let off steam on a mixed surface around the old runway, featuring gravel, concrete and mud. This was fast and furious and, for some, the temptation was to let rip and give it their all but, with dozens of marshals watching for cone penalties and stopastride infringements, it paid not to get too throttle happy.

The tempo slowed somewhat during the first Regularity through Cowesby. This map-based section fully engaged the navigators who had to plot a route through the section via various specified points and keep the car moving at the correct average speed. After a Passage Control atop Osmotherley Moor the route dropped down into Helmsley to enjoy some excellent hospitality at Duncombe Park House. This was the location for both the morning and lunch Time Controls and, perhaps more importantly, four Tests through their woodland: two after the coffee halt and two after lunch.

Between these pit-stops we amused ourselves with a Regularity from Newburgh Priory and a loop towards the ruins of Rievaulx Abbey before returning to Duncombe for an excellent midday meal. With our time in Helmsley over, we set a course for a Passage Control on Caulkleys Bank and

the third Regularity through the Wolds. This was another map-based challenge with slightly more complexity.

It had been a great day so far, but the best was to come as we struck out towards the Garnet Lane Passage Control and the final Regularity in Bramham Park. This epic finale took in more than six miles of pristine gravel and ancient woodland. An accurate trip meter was essential here but, whichever track they chose, all roads eventually led to the Main Time Control at the nearby Bowcliffe Drivers Club.

Our host, fellow competitor and local Bentley Boy, Jonathan Turner, had laid on coffee and refreshments. After that we hit the road for the 14-mile journey to the night halt in Harrogate, giving the crews time to reflect on what they'd achieved, before enjoying some well-earned refreshment and sitting down to an equally well-deserved dinner.

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# Day 3 North Yorkshire (94 miles)

## 30 March 2025

The Yorkshire Dales were our playground for this final day of the *Generations Rally*. As the day dawned bright and clear, an action-packed circular route around Harrogate lay ahead, as engines fired up and the crews readied themselves for a final assault on the leaderboard. There were possibly two sorts of competitors this morning, those content with their position and wanting to cement it, and those who felt they had something extra to give and were keen to move up a position or two. Three Regularities and three Tests took the Rally on a helter-skelter ride alongside reservoirs, rivers, and to religious establishments, with a coffee break and Time Control at Jervaulx Abbey.

Appropriately, for the day of rest, we began gently enough with a Route Check and Passage Control channelling the cars over the River Nidd and into the first Regularity through the Ure Valley towards Wensleydale and the north. Two Tests within the Catterick military training area blew away any lingering lethargy, with a slalom through the Sheep Dip, followed by a long twisting sprint up the hill to Flat Wood.

Some excellent coffee and cakes in the Jervaulx Tearooms stoked the fire for the day's second Regularity. This ran up and over a windy Pott Moor and alongside the white caps of Leighton Reservoir, before a dramatic descent into Ramsgill and a fly-by of the beautiful Yorke Arms where we spent a few memorable nights during the Yorkshire Cloverleaf.

Another short Test at Coldstones Quarry and a Regularity above Thruscross Reservoir was now all that stood in the way of the finishing arch in front of the Majestic Hotel and a hard-won cold beer on the sun-soaked terrace.

The afternoon's prizegiving lunch, jointly compered by Fred Gallagher and Mark Appleton, saw the crews tucking into platefuls of local delicacies such as roast beef and Yorkshire pudding, followed by rhubarb frangipane as they waited expectantly for the silverware to be handed out.

It was confirmed that Jack and Simon Brien in their 1972 Porsche 911 and Dermot and Rachel Johnson in a 1933 Alfa Romeo GS had won the Classic category and the Pre-war category, respectively. The father and son crew of Jack and Simon were understandably delighted with their second consecutive win and, after catching his breath, Simon said that "This was an amazing result for us. I'm overwhelmed to have won this rally for a second time. It's been another magnificent event - incredibly well-organised and, as usual, the Rally the Globe team have put together a fantastic route and a great bunch of competitors to share it with.

Jack and I split the driving duties and we had no cross words, except for one, when I picked up a penalty for straying onto the grass on the first day! The Porsche has been great. We prefer the Tests and Jack drove them very well, so we had a lot of fun."

Jack agreed and said that the great thing about the event is getting to see some familiar faces and old friends, but also meeting new people and making new connections. "I think you'll see us again next year".

Dermot Johnson thought that "the event had been absolutely fabulous and Yorkshire is so beautiful that I want to come back here on holiday. I've met some people who I rallied with 40 years ago and haven't seen since.'

Rachel was equally effusive telling us that "This was my first rally and it has been amazing, I've really enjoyed it. I loved the Tests - when I wasn't scared - the scenery has been amazing, as has meeting lots of new people and" turning to her father, "spending the time with you".

Summing up the event, Fred and Mark thanked the entire *RtG* team for making the weekend such a success, including Iain Tullie and Anthony Preston for their hard work devising an amazing route. Special mention was also made of Bob Hargreaves and the dozens of local marshals who'd given up their weekend to put the scores on the doors.

Tomorrow work starts in earnest on the fifth edition of the *Generations Rally*!
